Introduction: About 2700 years ago, a prophet by the name of Isaiah told us darkness and despair will melt away with the coming of the Messiah. Both for Jew and Christian one verse in [Isaiah 9](#) points us to God's solution for all of man's trouble. 2 The people who walked in darkness
have seen a great light;
those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness,
on them has light shone.

3 You have multiplied the nation;
you have increased its joy;
they rejoice before you
as with joy at the harvest,
as they are glad when they divide the spoil.

4 For the yoke of his burden,
and the staff for his shoulder,
the rod of his oppressor,
you have broken as on the day of Midian.

5 For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult
and every garment rolled in blood
will be burned as fuel for the fire.

6 For to us a child is born,
